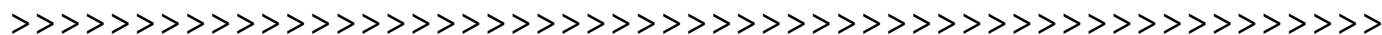
➡ ST. ANTHONY CHRISTMAS FAIR ←

13-14 Oct: CHANGE: I have decided to put off the individual consecrations until AFTER Fr. Jobe comes to tell us about the Militia Immaculatae (MI) sometime after the beginning of next year. It seems to me that people will understand

the individual consecration better after Fr. Jobe's explanation. Then we can decide whether to do the individual consecrations at Mass, as a group or in a separate ceremony.

Parish Consecration: On the weekend of 7-8th December at all the Masses.

Early Next Year: Fr. Jobe Abbass, OFM Conv., whom you know from his previous visits, will come to Rye to speak to us about the Militia Immaculatae which will be a fitting fruit of our parish consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Fr. Jobe is presently travelling to every parish in Our Lady of Angels Province promoting the MI.

Wisdom from our new Saint, John Henry Cardinal Newman: *I sought to hear the voice of God and climbed the topmost steeple, but God declared: "Go down again - I dwell among the people.*

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Understanding the Liturgy: One of the problems that developed with the *Novus Ordo* (the New Mass) was its wordiness which eliminated any time for contemplation. In the *Old Mass* there was lots of time to think about the mysteries of our redemption that were being re-presented on the altar. Some followed along with their missals, some prayed the Rosary, some used prayer books while others meditated on some event in the life of Christ. Modern liturgists are aghast at this reality and often criticize such actions in a very sarcastic way. The truth is that we don't have to be thinking about the same part of our redemption as long as we are lifting up our minds and hearts to God. Just think about the Humility of God Who speaks to us in the Scriptures, Who allows us to speak to Him and ask of Him favours, and then becomes our Spiritual Food in the changing of the Bread and Wine into the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. **WOW!!!**

In order to allow more time for contemplation and to decrease the wordiness of our daily Mass, I am going to eliminate the General Intercessions and not give a homily on Wednesdays, Saturday mornings and on Tuesdays when I have a deanery meeting. This does not mean that the intentions that you hold in your hearts will be eliminated from Mass. In addition to thanking God for salvation, each person who attends Mass comes with his or her own reasons for thanksgiving, praise and intercessions for people and events. Each person offers these petitions to God in silence; they do not have to be spoken out loud. Especially immediately after the Consecration of the bread and wine and right after receiving Holy Communion are two particularly effective times to bring those persons, family events, national happenings and world-wide problems to God in prayer. The words are not as important as the bringing of them into your mind as you lift up all of these concerns to the Father in the Name of Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit.

THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY IN THE TEMPLE [21 NOVEMBER]:

Though it cannot be proven historically, Mary's presentation has an important theological purpose. It continues the impact of the feasts of the Immaculate Conception and of the birth of Mary. It emphasizes that the holiness conferred on Mary from the beginning of her life on earth continued through her early childhood and beyond.

Reflection

It is sometimes difficult for modern Westerners to appreciate a feast like this. The Eastern Church, however, was quite open to this feast and even somewhat insistent about celebrating it. Even though the feast has no basis in history, it stresses an important truth about Mary: From the beginning of her life, she was dedicated to God. She herself became a greater temple than any made by hands. God came to dwell in her in a marvelous manner and sanctified her for her unique role in God's saving work. At the same time, the magnificence of Mary enriches her children. They—we— too are temples of God and sanctified in order that we might enjoy and share in God's saving work.
