Welcoming Jesus into our hearts

Cardinal Cantalamessa OFM recently shared in a homily in Rome that the Child Jesus comes to the door of our heart this Christmas to knock, offering Himself and God’s love as His gift. He told a story to illustrate how our Holy Mother offers Jesus to the world and how we need to become children-like to receive Him.

“A legend says that among the shepherds who went to see the Child on Christmas Eve, there was a shepherd boy so poor that he had nothing to offer Mary, and he stood aside in shame. Everyone competed to give Mary their gift. The Mother could not hold them all, having to hold the Child Jesus in her arms. Seeing the little shepherd next to her with empty hands, she then takes the Child and puts Him in his arms. Having nothing was his luck. Let's make this luck be ours too!”

Just like the poor shepherd boy, we have nothing to offer the Lord but our hearts and ourselves.

Did you know that Rye Town Council is running a support fund called Rye Relief in Need **RRIN** (Registered Charity no. 1075806). It is established to assist those normally residing within the town (parish boundary) of Rye who are in 'need, hardship or distress'. It is a fund that was created by generous bequests of past residents of Rye.

RRIN is able to make grants of money; or provide or pay for goods services or facilities; for individuals in need, hardship or distress. It can also make grants of money to other persons or bodies who provide goods, services or facilities to those in need. Somehow becomes lost.

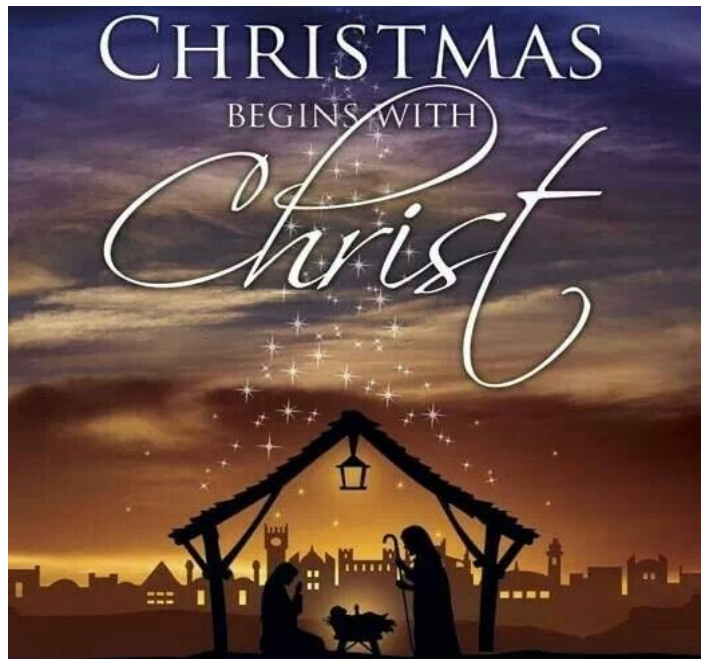
Amidst the tinsel, glitter
