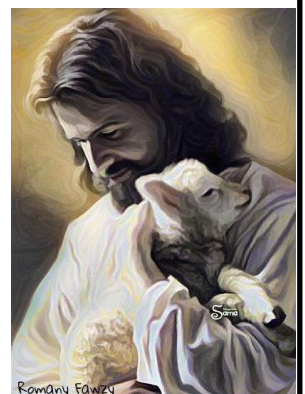
homes along with Mass intentions this week.

Why did God make us ?

In this weeks reading from Isaiah, we are told how God forms us all in the womb. He knows us completely from the moment of conception. He knows our every thought, action, temptation and difficulty. He also knows our true and most intimate selves, who we truly are -He knows our very souls and He loves us and calls us into a relationship with Him.

The Catechism of the Church tells us that God created humanity, so that we might share in His own blessed life (ccc1). And for this reason God is continuously calling us to seek Him, to know Him and to love Him. And it is our response to this calling that is our faith in the one true God. As Jesus asks Peter—“who do you say I am?” (Mt 15:16). God is continuously asking us this question. If we can answer with all our heart “you are God /the Son of God”, then “our faith has saved us” (Mt 9:22).

And yet all relationships are built on a mutual knowing of each other. How can we love Christ if we do not “know” Him? God knows us better than anything or any one else and He loves us—how can we get to know the Lord better, deeper so we can truly proclaim Jesus I love you? Do we spend time getting to know Him, investing time in our relationship? After all Christianity is relationships—The Trinity , The Father, The Son, The Parish, The Community , The People—A community of Christ—with Christ, in Christ and through Christ.

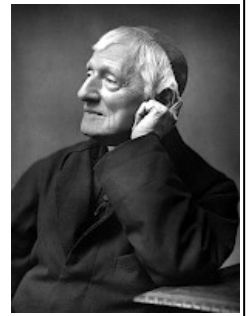


Exploring the Charity of Jesus as Christians.
