In today’s readings we see Jesus calling His Apostles, His Disciples to follow Him. Did you know the word disciple means “**follower**” or “**learner**”.

“PARENTING FOR FAITH “

There is a new online Catholic course starting for those with Babies and Toddlers, run by the long established and recognised organisation “Celebrate”. It will run for 5 weeks from Thursday 23rd February - March 23rd. It starts at 8.00p.m for approximately 45 minutes and it’s on zoom, so no need for babysitters! This bitesize course will inspire and equip parents, grandparents and carers of those with babies and toddlers through a short video, testimonies and small group chats.
