Just a thought

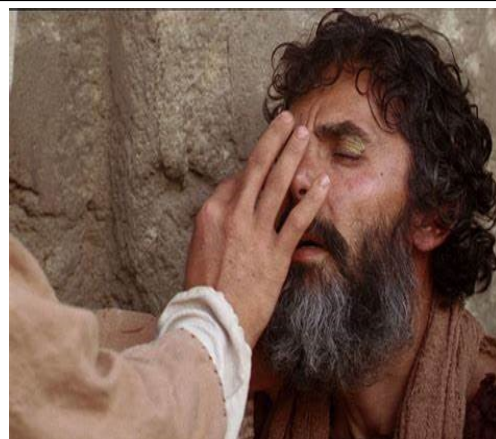
St John continues to bring us so much depth in this simple witness to the works of Jesus. Today's Gospel offers so many possibilities for our consideration, the challenge is almost, where do we start?

We could talk about the disciples' question and the relationship of sin and this man's blindness. Is it a punishment for his sinfulness? But is that how God really is?

Or we could talk about Jesus making a mud salve for the man's eyes. What's that about? Is Jesus restoring the physical sight for this man or is He also bringing him spiritual sight? How does Jesus open our eyes in our spiritual journey?

Another consideration could focus on the people's failure to recognize the blind man as a whole human being, seeing him only as his disability—do we fail to see those in need around us as God's children or as incomplete? Do they only see him as a blind beggar or as Jesus does—a whole man capable of glorifying God through his life?

Another teaching might look at Jesus as a law breaker, "working" on the Sabbath. Are we open to God surprising us? Why was the blind man able to see "the Son of Man" while the Pharisees who had the gift of sight fail to see Jesus for who He truly was?
