St Bonaventure on Meditation. The goad of conscience.

The meditation whereby the soul is cleansed, enlightened and perfected.

We make fruitful use of three powers within us: the sting or the goad of conscience; the light of reason and the spark of wisdom. If your intention is cleansing, turn your attention to the goad of conscience. If your goal is enlightenment, turn your attention to the ray of light. If your intention is perfection, turn your attention to the embers of wisdom.

As to the goad of conscience you must exercise thus: first by prodding, then by sharpening, and finally by redirecting your conscience to the good. Iniquity is a particular wickedness or malice of the will where evil is deliberately willed as a good.

You should examine whether you have been negligent in prayer, reading, or the performance of good works. Thirdly you must recall whether you have been careless in penance or repenting, resisting temptation, or progressing to holiness.
